- 1. Describe how this crime has affected you and those close to you. How have your relationships with your family, friends, co-worker and others been affected?
- 2. Has this crime affected your ability to function in day-to-day circumstances, such as at work, school, or home?
- 3. Has it become difficult for you to meet your financial or other responsibilities? Please describe.
- 4. Are there any other difficulties that you have experienced as a result of this crime that you wish to mention?
- 5. Can you describe the emotional impact of the crime on you and other family members?
- 6. Describe any physical injuries you may have sustained. Describe how long these injuries lasted or are expected to last.
- 7. Describe any medical treatment you may have received or are expected to receive in the future.
- 8. A judge can order a defendant not to have any contact with you, your family or place of business. Do you desire a "no contact" order to be a condition of any sentence or probation?
